


Virginia Bar Passage






Employment

(long-term, full-time, bar passage required, JD advantage as of March 15)






Practice Setting for Class of 2020



Proposed Construction Timeline January 2022-Summer 2022

Schedule is preliminary and subject to change.

Phase 1: January 2022-April 2022

- Dean's suite, faculty/staff lounge, dean's conference room
- Some 2nd floor faculty offices
- CDO
- Admissions
- Atrium
- Affected faculty and staff will be relocated to Sarah Brunet Hall across from International Building

Phase 2: Summer 2022

- Library (not including the front part, e.g. circulation desk, computer lab)
- Faculty offices in the Barnes Suite

 - Remainder of the 2nd floor faculty offices
 - 3rd floor faculty offices
 - Development suite
- Phase 4: Spring 2023
 - Front of library (e.g. circulation desk, computer lab)
 - 1st floor faculty offices
 - Davis Room
 - 114
- Phase 5: Summer 2023
 - Moot Court Room
 - 101/102
